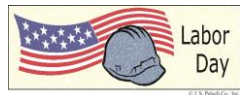

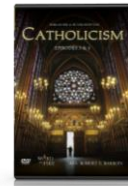
PARISH OFFICE CLOSED: Please note the Parish Office will be closed Monday, September 3 for Labor Day.
